PART 2: A MINYAN FOR THE MESSIAH!

n this amazing Gospel outreach to the Jewish people of Israel, the Lord indeed "did awesome things we did not expect" (Isaiah 64:3). A powerful example of this very thing happened in Jerusalem while witnessing for the Messiah to the Jewish people living there.

After prayer on the morning of November 5, we felt led by the Spirit of God to go and pray at the Western Wall and then walk through the Jewish quarter of the Old City. Our stop at the Western Wall was undoubtedly a distinct display of the providence of God; for while we were at the Wall praying, an Orthodox Lew approached Robert and me to ask us if we were Toda

Orthodox Jew approached Robert and me to ask us if we were Todd Baker Jewish. I told him through an interpreter that we were Jewish in our hearts by virtue of the fact that we have Jesus the risen Messiah living in us. He asked us this question because he wanted us to help him make a minyan in the synagogue adjacent to the Western Wall so that he could say formal prayers from the Siddur (the official prayer book of Judaism). A minyan is a group composed of ten men above Bar Mitzvah age (12 years old) and, in Jewish law, is required in order for a prayer or synagogue service to occur. Both Robert and I jumped at this opportunity - we knew that this was a golden opportunity from God by providential arrangement to witness to these Orthodox Jews about why Jesus is the Messiah of Israel.

After the prayer service, one of the Orthodox Jews asked where we came

from. When we told them that we lived in Dallas, Texas, one of the men asked me if I knew a certain Rabbi there. I said that I not only knew him well, but also that he comes to visit Jewish patients in the hospital where I am currently working as a chaplain. The other two Orthodox men said they knew this Rabbi as well.

One went to Yeshiva school with his son and the other had attended this Rabbi's synagogue when he used to live in Dallas ten years ago! What are the chances that these three men, totally unrelated to each other, as well as I, knew this rabbi?

God obviously arranged this meeting in the Synagogue next to the holiest site in all of Judaism so that the Messiah Jesus could lovingly be shared with them. For the mutual association we shared in knowing this Rabbi allowed

Robert and me to relate to them our love for Israel and the Jewish people. We explained how God is regathering them back to their ancient homeland in preparation for the return of the



Messiah as foretold by Moses and the Prophets. We then said plainly to them that the Scriptures both from the Enach (Old Testament) and Brit Hadashah (New Testament) reveal this Messiah to be none other than Y eshua min Nazarit (Hebrew for "Jesus of Nazareth"). Incredibly , they listened to us without rebuff or visible displeasure as one might expect, but gladly received our testimony concerning Jesus in their own synagogue and received from us Messianic Jewish Gospel tracts giving further explanation and proof from the Jewish Scriptures why Jesus is the Messiah and must be believed in for salvation.

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od the Holy Spirit, as the Spirit of grace, continually ministers God's gracious love toward us as we fellowship with Him in prayer and the study of His Word (Romans 8:15-16; Hebrews 10:29). The prophet Zechariah predicts that when Jesus returns to this earth at the Mount of Olives (a hill that looks east towards Jerusalem) in power and great glory, the Holy Spirit will give to the Jewish people "the Spirit of grace and supplication" enabling them to finally repent and accept the long rejected Jesus of Nazareth as their Lord and Savior (Zechariah 12:10).

Grace is a sovereign act of God whereby He kindly elects many to be saved while permitting many others to remain in their sins. The Bible calls this "the election of grace" (Romans 11:1-7). God used the nation of Israel as an example for all, electing some to the grace of salvation, while allowing others to be blinded in unbelief and left to perish in their sins because of their willful rejection of Jesus Christ. The grace of God freely bestowed on sinners is not based on our intellectual, physical, or moral abilities but solely upon the sovereignty of a mercy showing God in electing some by grace to receive eternal life (see Romans 9:14-16). Grace is boundless in its saving power. The cross of Christ contemplates and concludes all sin. It forever and completely absolves the believer from

every sin. The grace of God is thus limitless in forgiving power (see Ephesians 3:17-19; Colossians 2:13). Grace is God's unrestrained infinite love abundantly showered upon us.

Divine grace is the supernatural dynamic power of God that enables and

keeps us. God's grace enables us to live godly in this present evil world system (Titus 2:11-12). Those who truly receive saving grace will consistently exhibit such in an upright conduct before God and man. The lifestyle of a born-again Christian will be morally conformed to the ethical image of Jesus Christ and above reproach. This translates into holy living. "For God has not called us into immorality, but to holiness" (1 Thessalonians 4:7). God's grace enables us to bear the trials and infirmities of everyday living; the testing of our faith; and the constant opposition faced by the world, the flesh, and the devil. In spite of all this, Jesus assures every believer, "My grace is sufficient for you, for My strength is made perfect in weakness" (2 Corinthians 12:9; 4:6-16). Whatever enemy or obstacle may come our way the Word of God promises us that we are more than conquerors

through the Lord Jesus Christ who loves us (Romans 8:37). The grace of God abundantly enables us establish His will in whatever He has called us to do (Ephesians 3:20). Through the power of Christ indwells us. God is superabundantly above what we ask, think, or expect. divine This

superabundance far exceeds the greatest abundance man

can produce or offer. Grace given by God before and after salvation is not given first to save us, but first to glorify God. So in the end it is by the sheer unbounded kindness of God that any of us are accepted of Him.

God's grace enables us to walk our salvation out and produce good works acceptable to God through Jesus Christ our Lord (see Ephesians 2:10; Philippians 2:12-13; 2 Thessalonians 2:16-17). The great Reformer Martin Luther wrote, "One is not saved

by doing good works, but a saved person does good works." These good works are done after spiritual regeneration and are wrought by the new nature after the image of Christ. By

Matthew 13 and the Prophetic Parables About the Present Age

Part 2 - the Parable of the Wheat and the Tares (Matthew 13:24-30; 37-43)

nce the divine seed is received within the barren womb of the unregenerate heart, it instantly causes a person to become "born again." After this spiritual rebirth occurs, the believing individual

becomes a child and heir of the kingdom of God by means of spiritual regeneration. The individual's citizenship changes from earthly to heavenly. Without being spiritually born from above in Christ, it is utterly impossible to be saved and inherit eternal life. This is not an option for mankind, but a necessity for entrance into heaven. Jesus clearly says in John 3:7: "You must be born again." For, "unless a man is born again be cannot see the kingdom of God" (John 3:3).

The wheat are then in fact all those who by faith in Christ have a redeemed nature "by the washing of regeneration and renewing of the Holy Spirit" (Titus 3:5). The good seed sown is simply the W ord of God—holy, pure, and untainted from the mortal erosion of time and circumstance. God's precious Word is forever settled in heaven (Psalm 119:89). The Word of God is without deceit and falsehood. "For Your Word is truth" (John 17:17). The Word of God has the power to impart eternal life (John 8:51).

The field in which this invaluable seed is planted is the world Christ ransomed with His shed blood. Jesus declared in verse 38, field is the world." The ever-saving truth that Christ died to save sinners is the kernel, or seed, if you will, of the Gospel. In the Great Commission given to the Church by Christ, the children of the kingdom are called on to sow this great Gospel seed in the field of the world. They are to joyfully proclaim that God so loved humanity that He gave His one and only unique Son to the death of the cross for the salvation of sinners. Christ gave all He had to buy the field of the world (Matthew 13:44). He is thus the sole owner of it as

Redeemer. "The earth is Lord's the fullness thereof; the world and

they that dwell therein" (Psalm 24:1).

The children of God are not without

considerable challenge. The tares, which Christ identifies as the children of the devil, are sown in the field along with the wheat as a clever imitation of the children of the kingdom. The tares are spurious Christians, who in reality

> are brutal enemies of the cross walking in the ungodliness of the flesh, "whose end is destruction, whose god is their belly, whose glory is in their shame, who mind earthly things" (Philippians 3:19). The tares are strategically planted along side of the wheat by Satan, their father, to oppose and fight the redemptive power of God's Word seed with its testified accompaniment of the offspring it produces, that being the children of the kingdom metaphorically referred to by Christ as the wheat.

The subtle satanic imitation of true wheat is an indicative feature of tares. In agricultural terms, tares are known as darnel, or more commonly called "bastard wheat." Darnel takes on the detailed appearance of wheat and is virtually indistinguishable from the true wheat by the everyday casual observer until the harvest time when the ears of the tares shockingly reveal black grains, which are poisonous. Prior to harvest time, though, the tares look exactly like the wheat positioned by them and are considered such based on their outward appearance. This disillusioning truth indeed disproves the old trite saying: "What you see is what you get." Darnel is a mendacious form of wheat. It looks like wheat but is not wheat. For it is totally degenerate in nature lacking fruitful outgrowth. It looks like wheat until fully-grown and ripe. Of such a lot belong the ungodly throngs in world Christendom that draw near to God with their mouths and honor Christ with their lips while their hypocritical unregenerate hearts are far from Him.

The tares are pseudo Christians who continuously resist the convicting power of the Holy Spirit and turn away from the discipline of the heavenly Father with offended disgust. They pridefully refuse to heed the lifegiving rebuke of the Church to repent in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins. It is written of such weedy counterfeits:"But if you are without discipline, whereof we are all partakers, then you are

bastards, and not sons" (Hebrews 12:8).

In verses 37-43, Christ gives the

interpretation of this parable. "He

Man. The field is the world, the good

seeds are the sons of the kingdom,

but the tares are the sons of the

wicked one. The enemy who sowed them is the devil, the harvest is the

end of the age, and the reapers are

the angels. Therefore as the tares are

gathered and burned in the fire, so it

will be at the end of the age. The Son

of Man will send out His angels, and

they will gather out of His kingdom

all things that offend and those who practice lawlessness, and will cast

them into the furnace of fire. There

will be weeping and gnashing of

teeth. Then the righteous will shine

forth as the sun in the kingdom of

their Father. He who has ears to

hear, let him hear."

Israel: The Super Sign of the End-Times (Part 10)

he prophecy of Ezekiel 37 is surely by far the greatest singular fulfillment of Bible prophecy in the present day since the time of Christ. The prophecy begins with Israel in a moribund condition of despair, desolation and hopelessness. The prophecy opens with a vision God gave the prophet Ezekiel of the fallen nation of Israel depicted as a scattered pile of dry, bleached, and lifeless bones lying across an open valley floor.

"The hand of the Lord came upon me and brought me out in the Spirit of the Lord, and set me down in the midst of the valley; and it was full of bones. Then He caused me to pass by them all around, and behold, there were very many in the open valley; and indeed they were very dry"

(Ezekiel 37:1-2).


The Lord informs the prophet that this disturbing scene of skeletons strewn as far as the eye could see pictures the scattered and hopeless state of the Jewish people throughout the world, cut off and without a national homeland seemingly left for dead as a people in the nations where they had long been dispersed.

"Then He said to me, "Son of man, these bones are the whole house of Israel. They indeed say, 'Our bones are dry, our hope is lost, and we ourselves are cut off!' (Ezekiel 37:11)

One cannot help but see here in this macabre imagery how accurate of a picture this was for Israel during the Diaspora, especially during the time of the Holocaust when literally millions of the people of Israel were gathered in mass open graves where bodies were left to decay into skeletons indiscriminately piled one on top of



the other. When the Western Allies liberated the Jews from the Nazi concentration camps, they were utterly horrified to see the very thing Ezekiel describes about Israel in Ezekiel 37:1-2; skeletal remains and corpses of thousand and thousands of Jewish men, women, and children carelessly scattered and piled in heaps everywhere. One British soldier and liberator's description of what he saw at the Nazi concentration camp of Belsen hauntingly underscores the Vision of Dry Bones when he observed that, "Corpses in every state of decay were lying around, piled on top of each other in heaps. There were corpses in the compound in flocks. People were falling dead all around, people were walking skeletons." The



Holocaust was the last and the worst of what the Jewish people endured in the Diaspora from the anti-Semitic Gentile nations and left many of them feeling, according to the prophetic words of Ezekiel 37:11, "hopeless," "cut off," and seemingly abandoned by the God of Israel to face such a terrible end.

But what was a hopeless condition for Israel beyond the help and ability of themselves and man to repair and rectify was not beyond the power of God. For in verse 3, God rhetorically asks Ezekiel if indeed the scattered House of Israel, pictured as dead dry bones scattered in an open valley, can ever be restored to live again.

"And He said to me, "Son of man, can these bones live"? So I answered, "O Lord God, You know."

Ezekiel wisely knew that what lay before him was humanly impossible to fix and that only the power of the Sovereign Lord could repair the



irreparable. From the outset, we see here that the origin of Israel's national restoration to their Godgiven ancient homeland would be supernatural in nature and a sole act of God in the affairs of man — a thing recently witnessed some 55 years ago with the rebirth of Israel in 1948! Furthermore, this restoration of Israel from the graveyard of the Gentile nations would be by the supernatural power of the Spirit of God. Thus we further read in Ezekiel 37:4-5,

"Again He said to me, Prophesy to these bones, and say to them, 'O dry bones, hear the word of the Lord! "Thus says the Lord God to these bones: "Surely I will cause breath to enter into you, and you shall live."

Here we see from the opening of Ezekiel chapter 37 that the Spirit of God reveals (vs. 1-2), predicts (vs. 4,7), and brings to pass that which concerns Israel's physical restoration as a nation and their spiritual regeneration (as predicted in verses 13-14) as a redeemed nation under the future reign of the King Messiah (verses 24-28). The breath of God mentioned here (who is revealed in the New Testament as the third Person in the Triune Godhead) is called Ruach in the Hebrew text of Ezekiel 37:5 and is variously translated in Scripture to mean "breath," "wind," and "spirit,". The same Hebrew word used for the breath or Spirit of God here is also found in Genesis 2:7 when God made man a living, spiritual being and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and now the same Spirit is found again in Ezekiel 37 to be the very agent and Person involved in the resurrection and regeneration of the nation of Israel. The Spirit of God is the One who gives life to both the physically dead and the spiritually dead (see John 6:63; Romans 8:11, respectively) through the Word spoken and given to man. For

As we were returning to our car that evening, we noticed a man in a wheelchair playing with his puppy We stopped and petted his small dog and began to share with him about Jesus being the Messiah of Israel. The man' name was Joseph. He was obviously interested in what we were saying. The



Ruach Hakodesh (Hebrew for the Holy Spirit) of God was opening Joseph's heart to the Gospel, so much so that he invited us into his house for a deeper conversation.

In the course of our conversation with Joseph, he told us that he had a friend who was a Jewish believer

in Jesus the Messiah, and that he had extensively shared with Joseph the same things we were telling him about Messianic prophecy in the Thach and how they are fulfilled in Y eshua alone. We had an hour-long Bible study with Joseph from both the English and Hebrew texts of the Scriptures. One major subject of Messianic prophecy we studied with him was the fact the Messiah would be raised from the dead as King David foretold 1,000 years before Jesus was born (Psalm 16:10-11) and the corresponding fulfillment by the resurrection of Jesus of Nazareth in Acts 2:22-36.

In broken English, Joseph said he could accept that Jesus is the Messiah and was the same as God! Robert and I made sure this is what he said and meant; it was, and we were quite amazed at what the Spirit of God was doing

He then exclaimed to us several times over "Yeshua Ha Mashiach" (Jesus is the Messiah) and "Yeshua is the same as God."

here in bringing this Jewish man to faith in the Messiah of Israel. Robert and I then went over Scriptures that clearly pointed to Jesus as being the only valid way to God and the sole means by which one is saved from the penalty of sin, and the power of hell and death. This salvation consists of believing that Jesus is Adonai (Hebrew for "Lord") and that God raised His Son from the dead to give us life with Him forever (see John 14:6-7; Isaiah 49:7-8; Romans 10:9-10).

After this, we went through the plan of salvation as laid out in Pa\(\text{Pa\(\text{New}\)} \) Testament book of Romans known as "The Roman Road of Salvation". When we completed this study with Joseph and made sure he understood this life-giving message of the Gospel, we asked him if would like to invite Yeshua into his heart as Lord and Messiah to become a fulfilled Jew born anew in Messiah. Joseph eagerly answered "yes" and prayed with us and was gloriously saved right there on the spot! He then exclaimed to us several times over "Yeshua Ha Mashiach" (Jesus is the Messiah) and "Yeshua is the same as God."

Needless to say, Robert and I greatly rejoiced with the angels in heaven over this soul who repented and believed in Jesus the Messiah to truly become a son of Abraham. Coming out of Joseph's house after witnessing this miracle of salvation, I thought to myself that if I were unable to go to Israel anymore or my life should abruptly end, it was worth all the arduous toil, long hours of witnessing, and twenty years of hardship, struggle, and studying the Scriptures to see this dear Jewish brother become a child of God through his faith in the Jewish Messiah.

The following morning, Robert and I went to an outlet mall about three miles north of where we were staying. Once we got there, Robert noticed a store where lamps and light fixtures were sold. He told me that he once sold lighting merchandise and so we used this past occupation of his to establish a point of contact with the store manager. This further opened the door to share the Gospel with him.

The manager's name was Asher In our witness to him, we explained how

both the Tenach and the Brit Hadashah are bound as one in the Messiah Jesus. Just as Goo gave prophetic signs for His firs coming in the Scriptures that were literally fulfilled, so even



now God has given the world a sign in Scripture that the Messiah is about to return - the prophetic sign and fulfillment of the Jews' return to their ancient homeland from the Diaspora (Isaiah 11:11-12).

Asher replied that he had briefly studied the New T estament in school for only its historical value. We encouraged him to study the detailed prophecies of the Messiah as foretold in the Tenach and their accurate fulfillment in the life of Jesus of Nazareth as recorded in the New Estament. We concluded our witness to Asher and his co-worker by saying that Jesus was more than a mere man but was the divine Messiah who conquered death by His resurrection; and if someone claiming to be both Lord and Messiah as Jesus proved Himself to be by rising from the dead, we had better listen and believe in what He has to say

We thanked them for their time and left them with a Hebrew Newe stament and Gospel tracts so that they could search the matter for themselves and come to the knowledge of the truth. This is exactly what Yeshua commands every person to do in John 5:39. "Search the Scriptures. For in them you think you have eternal life, and they are they which testify of Me." 🕸 🕆

Continued from page 4 when God speaks, it is done as witnessed by the creation of the cosmos (Genesis 1) and is now currently being seen with the restoration of the Jewish people back to the land of Israel — a thing spoken and predicted by God some 2,580 years ago through the prophet Ezekiel presently witnessed and fulfilled in our day with the Jews continuing to return to Israel since they became a nation again in 1948!

But observe from verses 5-8 that this national restoration currently happening in the last five decades will be progressive and gradual in nature as the bones first come together on the skeletons, and then flesh forms on them with the skin to cover them following after to complete the physical process. For God goes on to say about this gradual restoration of Israel,

"I will put sinews on you and bring flesh upon you, cover you with skin and put breath in you; and you shall live... So I prophesied as I was commanded; and as I prophesied, there was a noise, and suddenly a rattling; and the bones came together, bone to bone. Indeed, as I looked, the sinews and the flesh came upon them, and the skin covered them over..."



This at once shows the regathering and restoration not to be a sudden and completed event, but one that will be gradually fulfilled over an extended period of time and then will finally culminate in a complete restoration when the King Messiah Jesus returns to Israel to establish His universal kingdom over all the earth as the closing verses of Ezekiel 37 clearly predict (read Ezekiel 37:21-28).

Failure to recognize the particular feature of this prophecy concerning Israel's gradual restoration to the land before Messiah Jesus returns has caused several Bible teachers (DrMark Bailey President of Dallas Theological Seminary and Dr. D. James Kennedy with all his misled signatories of "The Open Letter" of Knox Seminary to Evangelicals and other interested parties) and noted Seminaries (like Moody, Dallas, and Talbot, to name a few), that were known for supporting Israel in the past, to question and doubt that present day Israel is a fulfillment of End-T ime Bible prophecy. They apparently do so in ignorance of not carefully looking at the verses of Ezekiel 37:1-12 that predict the gradual restoration of the Jews back to the land of Israel in the last days before the return of Christ and therefore fail to rightly correlate it with what is presently being fulfilled today with the modern state of Israel restored and reborn right in front of their very eyes! One can only tragically conclude about them, by their refusal to see and believe this, what Jesus said of the Sadducees: "You do err, not knowing the Scriptures nor the power of God" (Matthew 22:29) ♥


